**a “Short” report**

The school year has gotten off to a smooth start, although some changes were made to our second and third grade classes the first few days of school. Due to lop-sided class sizes, one second grade teacher was moved to third grade to open another section. Class sizes in both those grades are now 24 and 25. Thanks to the parents, students and teachers involved in those switches, disruptions to the learning environment were minimized.

Parent nights were attended by sixty-five parents this week. During these meetings, parents heard an explanation of our grading system, saw various classroom texts and student materials, had a demonstration of the features of our JBS website, [jbs.gcsc.k12.in.us](http://jbs.gcsc.k12.in.us), and learned about this year’s “purple ticket” system. All K-3 classroom teachers produce weekly classroom newsletters. Be sure teachers have your e-mail address or preferred way of receiving this important piece of information. If you are not seeing the newsletter, contact your child’s teacher.

If you have left a message for a teacher and haven’t received a response within 24-48 hours, call the front office. Our phone system has experienced some problems over the summer, and some of your e-mail messages may be caught in spam. It is the intention of all of us to return messages within 24-48 hours, usually much sooner. Please send notes to the teacher for any daily changes in your child’s transportation.

Please help us keep our children with severe peanut allergies safe here at school. We are asking that children in grades 1 and 2 who bring peanuts as part of their lunch from home wash their hands after eating. These students will stop by the sinks on their way to lunch recess. This precaution will minimize the risk of contact with peanut butter on the recess equipment.



## Conscious Discipline Program



Our school uses the concepts of *Conscious Discipline*, which is a program created by Dr. Becky Bailey. It is based on brain research and centers around keeping children safe. It supports the value of being a school family. It teaches seven main discipline skills: composure, encouragement, assertiveness, choices, positive intent, empathy and consequences. *Conscious Discipline* emphasizes structures to reduce stress, i.e., “Friends and Family” boards, classroom jobs, School Family meetings, “Wish you Well” boards, choices and safe places.

At our first family meeting, children will learn that our staff’s job is to keep them all safe. They will also learn that **their** job is to help the adults keep it that way!

### **Nursing Notes**




